In 2017, we registered another 5,300 young people and over 71% voted in San Antonio's city election — tripling the millennial voter turnout in just two years. If you care about organizing our generation for change - from canvassing for voter registration to Get Out The Vote (GOTV) efforts - we want to talk. Responsibilities:

- Assist Special Projects Field Organizer and Fellow to recruit partners to co-manage site-based voter mobilization events across Texas
- Recruit and coordinate state-wide partners for National Voter Registration Day
- Participate in weekly team meetings, conference calls, and one-on-one check-in meetings with the Special Projects Field Organizer and Leadership Manager, as well as evaluations, debriefs, and trainings
- Recruit and coordinate volunteers for remote voter registration efforts, resulting in expanded voter contact in rural Texas areas
- Travel occasionally to major Texas cities to register voters at community events
- Assist the special projects team in the the execution of 10 early voting events and Election Day events, meeting defined outcomes
- Utilize this program to engage young and/or underrepresented voters and increase voter turnout



What we're looking for:

- Available to work some weekday evenings and weekends; willingness to work nontraditional hours
- Deep commitment to MOVE's mission of engaging more young people in our democracy
- Excitement for engaging young voters and turning them out to vote
- Enthusiasm for working within diverse and underrepresented communities
- Work style that is flexible, respectful and collaborative, and will maintain a supportive, empowering work culture
- Reliable transportation and a driver's license strongly preferred
- Spanish language skills are a plus, but not required
